In Memory of Bill Brewer

William Domas "Bill" Brewer, 72, died Aug. 30 at his home in Eagle Springs. A private burial was held at Pine Grove Baptist Church in Moore County.

He was a devoted and cherished member of the Moore County Historical Association for 15 years. He served six years as a board member and volunteered for all the activities involving the association, including the history tours. Bill was a mainstay at the Bryant House, helping with annual fundraisers, including Clenny Creek Day, the Christmas Open House also conducting tours of the Bryant House (1821) and McLendon Cabin (1760s), two historic house museums near Carthage.

One of Bill's most important contributions was a printed in-depth genealogy of the McLendon and Davis families who settled, built, and lived in the two historic 19th and 18th century dwellings now the property of the MCHA. The descendants of these families remain active in helping raise funds and doing other volunteer work to maintain and preserve the two houses.

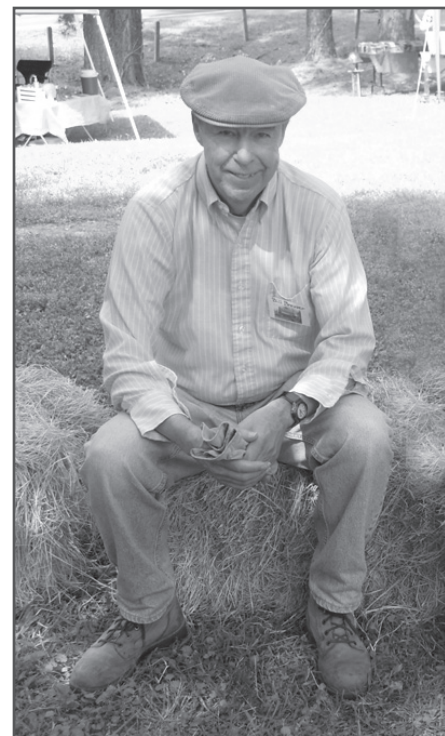
Board member Marilyn Hartsell said "all of us who knew Bill will remember his kindness, thoughtfulness, and his willingness to share his love of history."

Another longtime board member, Frieda Bruton, a past co-president, said "Bill was a man who was willing to help if he thought his help was needed. The Bryant House/McLendon Cabin needed him. He readily gave of his time and energy to save these properties.

"He was a reserved, highly principled man who endeared himself to those of us who worked with him on the ...Board. May his love of history dwell in all our hearts," she wrote.

Bill was born Sept. 14, 1939 in Newport News, Va. He graduated from Newport News High School and the Norfolk College of William and Mary (now Old Dominion University.) He received a Master's Degree from the University of Virginia in 1968, served four years in the U.S. Air Force, including 16 months in Vietnam. After 22 years teaching eighth grade English in the Fairfax County Public Schools he retired to a farm in upper Moore County that goes back to his great-great grandfather. Because he loved the land and its history, he chose to build his home there.

Bill was preceded in death by his parents, Aaron Domas Brewer and Foy Deaton Brewer, both originally from Moore County. Bill is survived by two sisters, Carol Johnson of Eagle Springs, and Barbara Dowaliby of Norfolk, Va.
